

 The RN to BSN Program courses are taught online with select experiential and
- practicum components through the Tarleton State University learning management system.

The RN to BSN option is for those who hold a current, unencumbered license as a registered nurse in the United States and are eligible for unencumbered licensure in Texas. Proof of

- unencumbered current Texas license must be demonstrated by the start of course work. Those awaiting to take the NCLEX-RN exam are eligible to take one course in the RN to BSN program, but must have an unencumered RN license before beginning subsequent coursework.
- ¹Any CHEM class meeting the following criteria will suffice for CHEM 1407: 4 hour course, has a lab, and is a General, Fundamentals, Introduction, College, or Organic Chemistry.

Degree Information

This 120 hour four-year degree plan provides a model for on-time completion of this TSU program using as many TCCNS courses as possible. The four-year plan also shows

- the first point when no TCCNS options are available for this program. See the current Undergraduate Catalog for course prerequisites. Course availability at TSU is subject to change, and the plan may change based on updates to TSU's course offerings.
 - Texas Common Course Numbering System (TCCNS) provides a shared, uniform set of
- course designations for students and their advisors to use in determining both course equivalency and degree applicability of transfer credit on a statewide basis.

<u>Individual academic programs may require specific courses contained in parts</u> of the University Core Curriculum as prerequisites for certain major

- <u>requirements.</u> Students who wish to take courses that will fulfill both core and major requirements simultaneously should check with academic advisors for assistance in selecting core courses.
 - Students meet the Writing Proficiency Requirement by completing two upper-level
- Writing Intensive courses in their major or courses designed for their degree program. Contact the Academic Advisor for additional information or questions.
- Residence is satisfied only by official enrollment in and completion of course work applied toward the degree requirements.

A minimum of 30 semester hours of work must be completed through upper level courses (3000 or 4000 level) delivered by Tarleton and 12 of these advanced hours must be in the major.

How does duplicating a course impact my GPA?

A student may take a course a second or subsequent time at the same institution. The highest grade will be included in the GPA calculation.

Can I take a course at another school and transfer it back to TSU?
 If you plan to take a course at another school and transfer it back to TSU, you need to meet with both an advisor and Transfer Services. An advisor can tell you the correct course number to take and assist with completion of a Concurrent Enrollment Form if needed.
